Big Success of the First Open Day at KIT

More Than 45,000 Visitors Experience Science and Engineering First Hand

For the first time, Karlsruhe Institute of Technology invited the public to come to an Open Day on September 25, 2010. On Campus North, institutes, infrastructure facilities, and partner institutions presented their work. About 80 sites to visit offered their guests a variety of interesting looks behind the scenes of the largest German science institution. The program also included popular science presentations and entertainment. About one third of the participating institutes came from the KIT Campus South. The Open Day met with high interest. their work together with their colleagues from Campus North.

In the 2010 Science Year, "The Future of Energy" also was in the focus of the KIT Open Day. The program was complemented by exciting experiments and presentations in all other KIT research areas, i.e. Climate and Environment, Nano and Micro Technologies, Elementary Particle and Astroparticle Physics, COMMputation - Computing and Communication, Mobility, Optics and Photonics, and Interactions between Humans and Technology.
