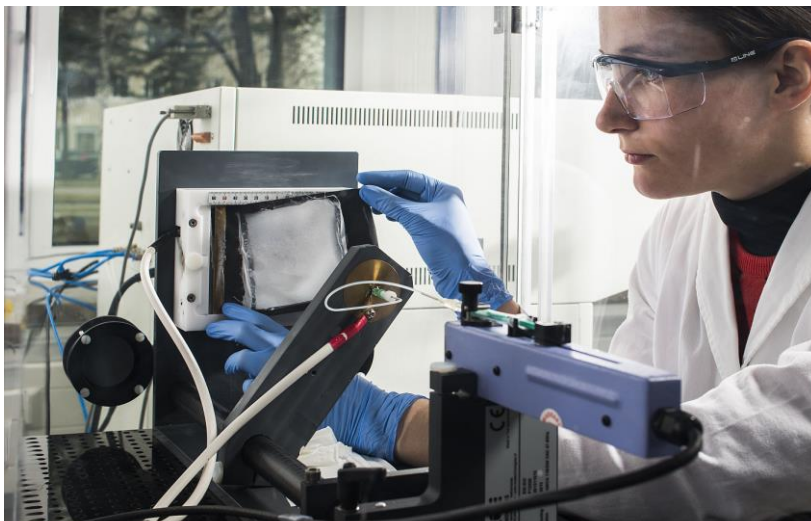


Panel Discussion: Young Scientists in the Focus
