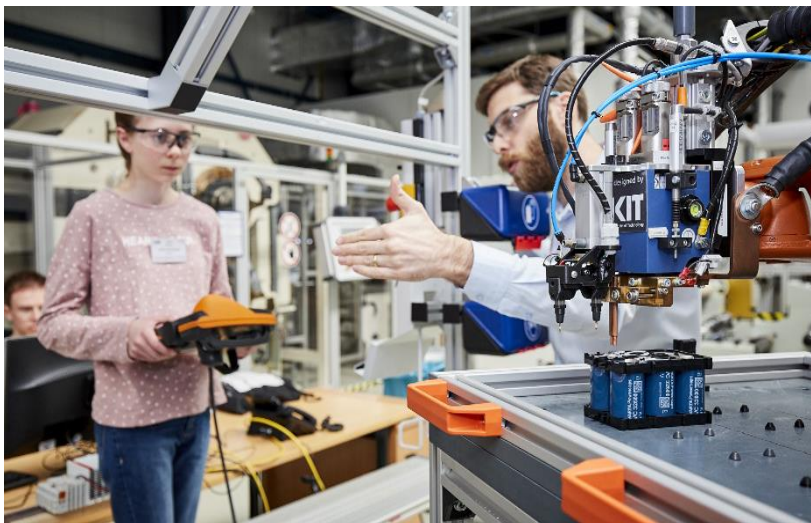


Girls' Day 2020: Studies and Vocational Training at KIT
